OBJECTIVE

These last few years have seen the development of many new lasers and light sources, each with proponents and opponents. The claims and disclaims that follow the development of these devices is often contradictory. A faculty of distinguished speakers presents their views and develops a consensus on many of these controversies and other emerging areas.
